**Dr. Marcel Machill** is the Bertelsmann Foundation's Director Media Policy. He is directing the project "Internet self-regulation" and responsible for the foundation's media policy research and project management. Dr. Machill holds academic degrees from three countries: After studying journalism in Paris, France (M.A.) and media policy and media economics in Dortmund, Germany (Ph.D.), he spent two years as a McCloy Scholar in Cambridge, USA, at Harvard University. There, at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, he received a Masters Degree in Public Administration (MPA). Dr. Machill has published several books and articles on media policy and journalism culture. He served as an editor and consultant for Euronews-Television in Lyon, France, and for Radio France International in Paris. He also worked as a journalist for the Public Service Broadcasting in Germany (WDR, Deutsche Welle), for the German Television Studio in Washington, D.C., as well as for newspapers such as Die Zeit and Frankfurter Rundschau. Dr. Machill has been a research fellow at the "Laboratoire Communication et Politique" of the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique in Paris and a lecturer in media policy and European journalism at various universities such as Dortmund, Düsseldorf and Münster (Germany).
