8 it down in the room so we can hear from our panelists.

9 Our next issue panel -- again, I would ask your
10 patience in keeping it down. Please come to the table as I call
11 your name.

12 To help us grasp the complexity of the current debate
13 we have three speakers who've had personal involvement in at
14 least one aspect of the current debate in California.

15 Ladies and gentlemen, I am going to ask for order in
16 the room, please. Thank you.

17 All of our panelists have been involved in at least
18 one aspect of the current debate in California. Mr. Daniel
19 Tucker, who is Chairman of the California-Nevada Indian Gaming
20 Association; Mr. Daniel Kolkey, Counsel to Governor Pete Wilson
21 and Legal Affairs Secretary, State of California; and Mr. Howard
22 Dickstein, partner of Dickstein & Merin and Counsel for the Pala
23 Tribe.

24 As we begin this panel, I remind our speakers that
25 you are presumed to be under oath and that each of you will have
26 15 minutes to summarize your prepared testimony, and after your
27 remarks Commissioners may ask questions. I would also encourage
28 dialogue at that time.
